# IUPAC FOR AFRICA: POSTGRADUATE SUMMER SCHOOL ON GREEN CHEMISTRY

The International Union of Pure and Applied Chemistry (IUPAC) Summer School which was hosted by the University of Dar es Salaam (UDSM), University of Dodoma (UDOM) and the Tanzania Bureau of Standards (TBS) in collaboration with the Tanzania Chemical Society (TCS) in Tanzania attracted young chemists from Africa, Europe and beyond. From 12th to 19th May, the young chemists where exposed to thorough and intensified training and teachings on Green and Sustainable Chemistry. The school provided the best thought provoking lectures from renowned scholars such as Prof. Zhou Qifeng, the IUPAC President, Prof. Tundo (The Chemistry of Dimethyl Carbonate), Prof. Peter Licence (Ionic Liquids i vacuo – suck it and see!), Prof. Christopher Brett - IUPAC President-Elect (Green materials and Electrochemistry), Prof. Neil Coville (Carbon nanomaterials from propylene waste), Prof. Darkwa (Catalysis driven conversion of substrates in chemical production: selected examples), Prof. Mammino (The design of environmentally-benign substances: Interfaces between green chemistry and computational chemistry), Prof. Urassa (Global Networking for Professional Training and Development in the Chemical Sciences: ACS Model), Prof. Jiang, Prof Obuzor (Nature the Chemists' Untapped Warehouse), Dr. Kasozi (Environmental sustainability utilizing renewable feed-stock, chemical waste and recycling), and Mr. Nannake-Abasi Offiong (Surfactant for Groundwater Remediation from Green and

Renewable Feedstocks). This event gathered around 100 participants from around Africa and Europe out of which two are young Periodic Table awrdees from

China and Nigeria (Xuefeng Jiang, S and Emmanuel C ohaekenyem, Sn). About thirty (30) students were sponsored to the school by IUPAC, United Nations Environmental Programme (UNEP), International Sustainable Collaboratve Center (ISC<sub>3</sub>), PHOSAGRO. The summer school provided the participants opportunity to develop, network, present research works and acquire research knowledge and skills. As part of the summer school, about 59 students who presented posters competed for the best poster award out of which Emmanuel C. Ohaekenyem a Nigerian from Nnamdi Azikiwe University Awka, Nigeria; Jemilugba Olufunto Tolulope (Nigerian) from University of Johannesburg, South Africa; Camila Renson a Tanzanian From University of Dar es Salaam, Tanzania; Florence Masese a Kenyan



from University of Nairobi, Kenya; Catherine from University of Nottingham.

#### CHEMICAL SECURITY IN KENYA

#### Introduction

there is no doubt that chemicals play a significant role in the modern world. However, chemicals have a dual nature and the use of chemicals has also led environmental pollution and atrocities especially during the world war. The term dual use of chemicals is used to describe the fact that chemicals can be peneficial and but at the same time find nefatious applications. This dual use of chemicals led to chemical safety best practices designed to protect people from accidental expensive to chemical hazards. Chemical security on the other hand are the best paictices designed to protect the chemicals from those who intentionally use chemicals to cause harm. The intentional use of chemicals to cause has dates back to 600 BC but was most significant during the first world war. Interestingly, prominent chemists such as Intz Haber (1918 Nobel Prize), Victor Grignard (1912 Nobel Pilize), Herriman Nerst (1920 Nobel Prize), contributed significantly towards the development of chemical weapons used in the first world war (Walter For & Hardesty, 2015) which brings to light code of ethics in chemistry, however, that is not within the scope of this article in heluse of chemicals in war, which caused unnecessary suffering to the soldiers and civil ans, led to several international agreements to ban the use of chemical weapons, the most successful of these agreements is the Chemical Wrapens Convention (CWC) which entered into force on 194 April 1997. and has now been accorded or ratified by 193 member states (OPCW, 2019). Despite 98% of the world having ratified or accepted to the CWC, chemical weapons continue to be misused in the world. Terrorist groups such as the Aum Shinri vyo (Walter, Ito, & Hardesty, 2015), ISIS and Al-Qae da (CIA, 2019) as well as members states such as Syria (OPCW, 2019) and fraq (Walter, No. 6 Hardesty, 2015) have reportedly continued to use themical weapons. In this legard, Chemical Security best practices. designed to protect chemicals from with relations intentions, continue to be an important global tool in pursuit of world beads.

The Kenya Chemical Society (KCS) is been spearheading the implementation of chemical security in Kenya, to mitigate against the intentional misuse of chemical weapons by groups such as Al Shabab who continue to commit atmociries in the region, the most recent being in January 2019 at a Hotel in Nairobi (Daily Nation, 2019). This article is highlights some of the chemical security projects that the KCS has been implemented in Kenya and the region.
